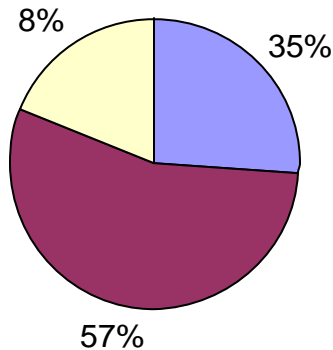
### REPORT TO TAXPAYERS FY20

Wes Watkins Technology Center is an educational institution accredited by the Oklahoma Department of Career and Technology Education and the North Central Association Commission on Accreditation and School Improvement.

Wes Watkins Technology Center was established in 1987 to provide high school and adults with quality career and technical education. District high schools served in Hughes, Okfuskee and McIntosh counties are: Graham-Dustin, Hanna, Holdenville, Moss, Mason, Okemah, Weleetka, and Wetumka.

**Technical Programs available are:** Business Technology, IT Network Support Specialist, Service Careers and Construction, Welding, Electrical Trades, Health Science Careers, Multi-Skilled Healthcare Provider, Practical Nursing, and Surgical Technology.

### HOW WWTC IS FUNDED



Local	35%	\$	1,721,779

Federal	8%	\$	373,291

**Local** comes from ad valorem tax on property, tuition and other local sources.

**State** comes from state funds allocated by the Oklahoma State Career Tech Department to technology centers.

**Federal** funds are provided in form of grants including Carl Perkins and Pell Grants.

### MONEY SPENT IN FY20

Expenditures for FY20 were \$4.555 million from the General Fund. The District is a service entity and as such is labor intensive. 74% of General Fund expenditures are for personnel costs (including salaries, wages, and employee benefits).

## FINANCIAL HIGHLIGHTS

The District's state formula allocation for FY20 increase by \$447,927 to \$2,672,568 due to the state funding the Health Benefit Allowance and state mandated raises for certified and support staff. The District was awarded an Oklahoma Education Lottery Grant of \$150,000.

The District's net assessed valuation for FY20 was \$160,537,875.
